

Friday, December 14th, there was a death in our congregation. A cherished and beloved member, Mr. Fred Bueker, was called home to heaven. May God continue to bless his wonderful wife and family with peace and comfort. Fred was blessed with a heart transplant 14 years ago, and we give thanks for this miracle of medicine and heart surgery. The organ donor was a twenty year old man named Wade. Wade was a generous "giver," and he had a generous heart. He was a caregiver for his invalid grandmother, who lived in San Diego. Wade was of Asian descent, was a Buddhist, a leader with the Boy Scouts of America. He rode a motorcycle and, 14 years ago, he was hit and killed by a drunk driver. Fred received Wade's heart, and lived an additional 14

years to love and enjoy his family, church, and all of life. Wade was honored at Fred's memorial service on December 27th.

As a church congregation, our nation and world have all been saddened and shocked by the death of 26 souls at an elementary school in Newtown, CT. The school district presented a community memorial service on Sunday, December 16th, which was shown live on the major TV stations.

Clergy of all Protestant denominations offered prayers for peace, comfort, and healing. A Catholic Priest gave blessings for the service and the people. Then, a Rabbi chanted a passage from the Old Testament book of Lamentations. It was mournful, most comforting, and beautiful all at the same time. He then prayed in English.

This was followed by a Muslim boy and his father taking part. The young son beautifully chanted a comforting Muslim prayer followed by his father's prayer in English. Then, an Indian woman prayed, followed by a Greek Orthodox Priest, and then a Hindu woman from India prayed a Hindu prayer.

Next was the State Governor, who presented a wonderful and most fitting tribute. He remembered Jesus' words, "A little child shall lead them." President Obama then spoke and used the scripture passage, "Let the little children come unto me, and forbid them not, for such is the kingdom of Heaven." A Lutheran pastor gave the final benediction in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Never, in my lifetime, did I imagine there would be an ecumenical service of such great proportions, that included the major faith expressions of all the world.

Also, I want to share a special Christmas letter from Dr. Richard Cunningham, a most gifted Bible Study teacher, and his lovely wife, Mary. We are thankful for his teaching our Saturday Bible Study class. He quotes Longfellow's "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day." As Longfellow wrote verse three, he faced the reality of a world in turmoil and grief: "And in despair, I bowed by head. There is no peace on Earth, I said. For hate is strong, and mocks the song of peace on Earth, good will to men." Then Dr. Cunningham writes: "I love the hope and promise of verse four: 'Yet pealed the bells more loud and deep: God is not dead, nor doth He sleep. The wrong shall fail, the right prevail, with peace on Earth, good will to men.'

The promises God gives us at Christmas are still sure and secure. In a world that many unbelievers see falling apart, Our God is at work putting the pieces together in preparation for His Second Advent, when He will bring peace and good will to all men." Dr. Richard Cunningham, December 2012.


Dear Brothers and sisters in Christ,
