

The Inn Keeper's Story

Hello, I'm just another inn keeper in a little city called Bethlehem, but my story is beyond words. The week had been so chaotic, and mysterious. Why was this year do different? Now, as you might expect, I was exhausted at the end of each day and, when I closed my doors to the inn each night, sleep could not come soon enough.

As was my custom each night when I still had rooms available, I left my lamp in my window. Perhaps, due to fatigue, I forgot to take my lamp out of my window for, you see, on this night I had sold all my rooms. This time of year was very dear to me since this was when I made the most money. But it always bothered me when I had to turn people away.

It was late, and I was sound asleep, when I heard what sounded like someone knocking on my door. Who were these people? Could they not see that the inn was closed? Knock! Knock! Knock! The knocking did not stop, so I got up and went to the door. It was then that I realized that I had not taken the lamp out of the window. I opened the door, knowing that I would have to give them the bad news that I had no more rooms. There, in front of me, stood a young couple and, to make matters worse, the woman was pregnant. I thought she was going to have the baby right there. My heart sank as I had to tell them that I had no more rooms, but what could I do? The man spoke first, "Surely, you still have one room left. After all, your lamp is still in the window." I know, I said, I am sorry. But I was so tired, and forgot to take my lamp out of my window. Then the woman spoke softly, "Please sir, we have traveled for over a day and we are also tired, and I am afraid that tonight may be the night that my son is born. Don't you have anything we can just lay down and rest in?" My heart was broken, of all the people to leave out in the cold. I gazed up into the sky, as if to say "What can I do?" It was at that moment that I saw the star that had been shining so brightly this pas week, and I thought to myself, I do have a stable out back, and there is some hay that can be like a bed, just for the night. So I offered them my stable. It was not much, but at least it was a shelter. And with the star so bright, there would be plenty of light. "Thank you, thank you," the couple exclaimed. "We will make it right with whatever we owe you in the morning. Thank you!" There were no words for me to say. This couple was truly unique. Who else would accept a stable to sleep in, especially being pregnant? No charge was all I could muster up to say. After all, could you charge someone to sleep in a stable with the likes of cows, donkeys, sheep, and probably chickens?

The next morning, I woke up at the crack of dawn, for I had slept restlessly worrying about that young couple out in the stable. I got dressed and ran out into the stable to see how they were, and there was the baby. He was so precious, just lying there sleeping with His mother and father. I just stood there in awe. The animals seemed to be singing softly to the baby. Mooo, Baaa, went the cows and sheep. And, as if the rooster knew the hard night this little family had had, not a sound did he make, as if to say, rest, sleep well. I went back into the inn and pondered what I had just witnessed.

In the days to come, people from kings to peasants came to see the baby. I noticed that the star, which had been ever present for so long, was no longer present. Who was this child? Was the star there to point the way to this baby? Perhaps, but why? Why were so many drawn to my little stable?

As I reflect back on that night, it truly was one of mystery and awe. When I found out who this child was, and what He would do for this world, I am amazed that He came into the world in the humblest of ways, but He would leave this world as the Greatest Man who ever lived. After all is said and done I, being just an inn keeper, learned to be willing to give all that I had, and as a result, I was rewarded for life. It was with no expectations that I gave all that I had, but I can tell you, I received the greatest gift in my life on that night so long ago.
