


The Bible shares the following statement: "Everything that happens in this world happens at the time God chooses."

Whether you were a participant, a survivor, a caregiver, a sponsor, cheerleader, donor or a friend of Relay, our mission to eradicate cancer for our generation and future generations would not be possible without your support. As of this writing, we have raised an astonishing \$6,620. We were pleased to receive a Five Star Award which included our very own private VIP area complete with a trendy purple tent, WiFi services which the kids used to play games, a cooler stocked with beverages, and pizza delivered at the dinner hour.

The Relay started with the Opening Ceremony. The other teams in attendance took up a collection and "bailed" us out. I can't wait to see the pictures of us behind bars.

Many thanks to the top team fundraisers, Willie Rasmussen, Ira Yoder, Jim Cassem and Wendy Eder. Willie, Ira and Jim were also Sponsors of the Moreno Valley Relay. Kudos to Alyssa Van Hoosier who manned our booth by making and selling rubber band characters. She took in \$60 in sales! Accolades to Shelley Palestis and Pastor for their posters that adorned our booth. And a special salute to our Logistics Team, Marv Egeland and Jim Cassem for putting up and taking down our campsite.
