

Subject: God works in mysterious ways

I used to ask the members of the congregations to send me meaningful articles if they know of one or read one. I received the following story from the members of

Zion Lutheran Church in Philadelphia, which was the first church I served when I was ordained in 1978.

A woman was at work when she received a phone call that her daughter was very sick with a fever. She left her work and stopped by the pharmacy to get some medication. She got back to her car and found that she had locked her kevs in the car. She didn't know what to do, so she called home and told the baby sitter what had happened. The baby sitter told her that her fever was getting worse. She said, "You might find a coat hanger and use that to open the door." The woman looked around and found an old rusty coat hanger that had been thrown down on the ground, possibly by someone else who at some time or other had locked their keys in their car. Then she looked at the hanger and said, "I don't know how to use this." So she bowed her head and asked God to send her some help. Within five minutes an old rusty car pulled up with a dirty, greasy, bearded man who was wearing an old biker skull rag on his head. The woman thought, "This is what you sent to me?"

But, she was desperate, so she was also very thankful. The man got out of his car and asked her if he could help. She said, "Yes, my daughter is very sick. I stopped to get her some medication and I locked my keys in my car. I must get home to home to her. Please can you use this hanger to unlock my car?" He said, "Sure." He walked over to the car, and in less than a minute the car was opened. She hugged the man and through her tears she said, "Thank you so much! You are a very nice man."

The man replied, "Lady, I am not a nice man. I just got out of prison today. I was in prison for car theft and have only been out for about an hour." The woman hugged the man again and with sobbing tears cried out loud, "Oh, Thank you God! You even sent me a Professional!"

We all need God's help from time to time. Whatever happens in your life, God knows how you are doing and he will guide you in the right direction. Sometimes what God presents to you may not be what you want or expect, but he knows the best course for you to take.

Are we ready??

Next year, our congregation will be **30 years old!** What a milestone!!

March 24, 1984: Lord of Life becomes an officially chartered congregation of the American Lutheran Church. There are 120 signers of the charter. A Church Council is elected.

Becoming a member of a church is an important part of the Christian life. Yet the trend these days is one of shunning the practice of organized religion and showing a distaste or fear of commitment, especially of institutions. What can **we** do and why are **we** still here? Here are some thoughts.

Let's Improve the Attendance of Current Members.

- At least once or twice each year teach and preach the importance of faithful worship attendance.
- Include a commitment to faithful worship attendance as part of a holistic annual stewardship commitment.
- Keep a record of attendance and monitor it.
- Know that it is important to respond to absentees before they drop out of active attendance.
- Form a worship membership care team to review attendance within 24 hours of each service.
- Send a handwritten note or call to anyone who has missed three Sundays in a row.
- Maintain a loving, invitational relationship with those who have been absent for five or more Sundays. Never be judgmental.
- Telephone every household in the church and everyone who has ever visited to invite them to some special event. "I hope you will be there."

Let's Invite New People to Attend Worship

- Decide today to open your minds, hearts, and doors to new faces, even if it means changing your music, sermon content, Sunday School, and enlarging your personal circle of friends.
- Pray for the unchurched in your community.
 Pray for children being raised outside the church, couples in marriages that don't have Christ at their center, etc. But pray also for specific families and individuals -- friends, relatives, associates, neighbors -- by name every day.
- At least once a year preach and teach the importance of becoming an inviting people.

- Know that personal invitations are the most effective method of increasing worship attendance. Invest sixty seconds once a week to invite someone to attend worship with you.
- Recycle your worship bulletins. Keep Sunday's bulletin handy until you have given it to someone along with your personal invitation for them to join you in worship.
- Distribute to members simple printed invitations during the Christmas and Easter seasons that they can give to family and friends. Print at the top of the card, "If you are not active in a church, worship with us this season."
- Have a "Bring a Friend Day".
- Know that the people who are on the fringe of your church are your future, your prospect list, and your next potential generation of deeply devoted disciples. Avoid the tendency to denigrate or alienate those who are not yet fully committed disciples.
- Find ways continually to invite these "near the edges" of your church, especially those who already have a positive impression of the church, such as those who have come to the church for a wedding, a funeral, or to vote and those who already worship a couple of times a year. Do not drop them from the newsletter or membership list.
- Distribute door hangers in target neighborhoods near your church. It is more effective to cover the same 500 doors six times, than to do 3,000 doors one time.
- Send mass mailers to targeted postal routes near your church 6 to 8 times a year. The backto school season, pre-Christmas, and pre-Easter times are logical for these mailing.

Let's Get Started-Let Go, Let God

We have been blessed through the past 30 years and the future looks great. We call ourselves "the miracle on Nason Street". Just look at what's happening. The new, expanded overpass and on-ramps are just about complete on Highway 60, the extension of Nason Street all the way to Iris is complete, and the street will be widened to four lanes from Cactus to Fir over the next two to three years. The recession is past and the new constructions are coming to our neighborhood. We must be ready to welcome the future and willing to listen to God's will. Pray for our church, our members and our community that we will be here to do what we have been called to do.
