

Mature Driver Training...

Every year when it is time to renew my auto insurance I get asked the same question: "Have you completed a Mature Drivers Training Course in the past 3 years?" Now, I will admit there are two problems that pop up when I hear that now familiar query. First, it means that somehow, over the course of my earthly journey, I have found myself being referred to as "mature." In today's boringly exhaustive overuse of political correctness, rather than feeling good that someone recognizes my maturity, I know in fact that the term "mature" here means "old guy." So the question falls into the same category as the joy I feel when the table server gives me the senior discount without even asking if I am a senior. Thank you very much!?

The other problem involves the total cost of attending the 8-hour Mature Driver class which is never available in the local community. How will that cost translate into savings on my car insurance bill?

The good news?? With classes in another community, people I know won't see me attending the class, which could save some embarrassment. Kind of like attending an AA meeting...

After years of hearing the question, there was suddenly a new option. My friends at AAA were offering, for the first time, the course on-line! I could complete the class in the darkened privacy of my own home – and at minimal cost! All my excuses for not doing the class were suddenly stripped away. So, I was a student again.

I heard the comment spoken once again as it related to Bible Study: "It's hard to be in a bible study class when I know so little about my bible." It is easy to feel uncomfortable in a bible class when everyone else in the class seems to know so much about it already. It seems everyone else knows where Ezekiel 34:1-2 is located in their 2,000+ page bible – a book which lacks even a helpful table of contents. They're done reading and I'm still looking for the page.

We're embarrassed when people see we can't even negotiate the book. How do we find the map for our lives if we can't find where we are on the map? Even my GPS needs to know where I am before it can be of any use to me.

Just like my Mature Driver class, the resources for God's people to read His Word, inspired by Him for the good and development of mature Christians, is endless. The Internet is a dangerous place! But it is also filled to the brim with Bible Study resources, commentaries, guides and maps which can make the Scripture a true "road-map" for your life.

Good Stewardship of the Earth is much more than an annual Earth Day, or recycling, or opting out of plastic when you're asked: "Paper or plastic?"

Maturity in God's Word brings us to understand those complicated and unpopular issues such as Law vs. Gospel, loving your neighbor even though he's "different", loving your enemy, loving God above all else – even more than our money, tithing, sacrifice, and recognizing our blessings as gifts rather than accomplishments.

My Mature Driver Graduation certificate is good for 3 years and will reduce the cost of my liability insurance for that entire time. That was my goal.

But the certificate and the cost saving to my auto policy became secondary to the information, knowledge and awareness that I gained through the class.

Aside from a thorough review of driving fundamentals, I was made aware of changes in me which put me at higher risk for an accident – changes all related to being "mature." As a result, I'm a safer driver today than I was yesterday.

My recommendation: curl up late at night when everyone else is sleeping, gather your favorite nighttime beverage and your "Bible for Dummies" book, and become a Mature Driver of your own life.




