

DOOR KNOCKING EVANGELISM

When I interviewed with the church council for Lord of Life's Interim Pastor over a year ago, I promised that I will do door knocking evangelism and hand out brochures about this

church as part of my commitment to help this congregation to grow. It's been a little over a year since then and I need to keep my promise. A brochure of our church is in the process of being made and when completed, I will begin knocking on doors street by street within a half mile of our church and then begin extending the area to a larger target area of Moreno Valley.

This was my methodology of evangelism and church development for the first 4 months of the new ministry I started in Grand Prairie. Texas. Mind you, I did this in Texas during the hot summer and into the fall months. Some experiences were pretty scary when I was told to "get lost" or when I had doors closed on my face. However, there were wonderful experiences as well when people would invite me in to their homes so that I could pray with them or when they were excited that they were asked to be a part of a brand new church. It was my experience that over half of the people who answered their doors were very friendly. A few volunteers and I were able to gather a core group of people who were interested in being part of a wonderful new and exciting community church.

South Grand Prairie, Texas was a new developing community and many new homes, parks, and schools were being built in the area. The volunteers and I had a good time and the more we went out and planned our target areas for the week and month the more confidence we developed and we felt empowered to continue to do the Lord's work and invite people to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Becci will oversee the production of the LOL church brochure, and I will make a plan to begin the door knocking evangelism street by

street. Yes, I might even knock on your doors so that I get to see a friendly face.

The best method of evangelism is simply personal invitation and that is to invite the "unchurched" person to attend Sunday worship with you.

I have faith and confidence that Jesus Christ is the one in charge of this evangelism. There are so many people living in our communities who have no idea of the love of Jesus Christ and that he died for our sins and promised us eternal life. Jesus will be with us as we go door to door and invite people to attend our church.

You may feel uncomfortable about door knocking evangelism. Many people may feel that religion is a personal matter and that we should not talk about religion or invite people to come to church. How then will people know and experience the joy of knowing Jesus and his love for all people? We have an obligation to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Evangelism is one of the highest priorities in the church and every one of us needs to take some small part in this endeavor.

We often talk about how to grow LOL church. We want new people to come and visit LOL. Now is the opportunity! Every one of you have friends who are not attending church for whatever the reason. It is exciting when someone who you invite becomes excited about attending LOL and following Jesus Christ.

Door Knocking is old fashion evangelism that has been proven successful in many areas. We won't know until we try! I want to ask LOL members to volunteer and help me with this experience. Together we can make a difference!
