

Because I write to you every week with my Ponderings page, I was a bit flummoxed about what to write about in the newsletter. Brianna came to the rescue with some questions for me to answer. Some were personal questions and I am happy to answer them. Let's continue with our in-home visits and do that. She did ask a much more important question.

What are my goals for Lord of Life?

The short answer is that my goals are your goals. Your goal is to grow the church. This is why I came. I believe it is also why God placed me here. And I think the newsletter is a good place to talk about how we are going to grow our church.

First of all, it is not magic. No one, let alone me, has a magic wand to wave to bring about growth. God is the author of growth and there is a particular order in God's methodology. In the Garden of Eden, God made Adam and Eve to participate in the care and management of the garden. They were given the job of stewardship over what God had created. That's our model.

God placed Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Moreno Valley, CA, to benefit the surrounding community and reach out to the world in the spirit of stewardship, or caring for one another. And God placed you and I in the position of stewards in that endeavor. As my gramma used to tell me, first you have to want to get anything done. If you don't want to, then you will work harder at not doing it than if you just got on with the project!

So first we take on the spirit of wanting to grow our church. That does, however, beg the question of why. An easy answer is that we die if we do not. So the stakes are high! How, then, do we want to?

This is a question worthy of lots of conversation, a bunch of experimentation and an amazing open-mindedness about what we do and why we do it. During the interview process before you called me, there was much conversation with the council for the need for hard work by everyone to make this a success. Pastors are not hired guns that come in and make things happen that the people don't think they can do. Like life, we are all in this together. The hardest work right now is being open-minded and patient. Right behind that is the willingness to be more than just one who goes to church and become one who is willing to be church.

Church is not just a place. It is an attitude and an activity. It is not just coming to be 'fed' the word and then going home until next week. It is coming together as community for the sake of the community. It is joining together as God's people and live out a plan each day to bring the good news of God's plan for all lives to be restored to the perfectness of the original creation. Being church includes engaging in worship and study and inviting others as well, even if you don't think they will come. And when they do come, and they will, often much to our surprise, we will be ready for them.

I would like a small group of people to meet with me maybe one Sunday a month for brunch and talk about how Lord of Life might live out God's plan for it as we go forward. Open to any age, any background, any gender. You do not have to feel like you have to be 'somebody' to be part of this. You are already the beloved of God and that is more than enough!




