

Our Lord is Risen! Now what?

Planning ahead requires a review of where we have been and a look at where we wish to go. 'Now what' sums that up nicely.

The past year has been exhilarating, revealing, and full of great promise for the future. Yes, we have some challenges and your council is working hard to help us meet them all. A bond proposal is before you that has the potential to saves us countless dollars in mortgage interest. Dollars of expense saved mean dollars available for ministry.

The end of April, we met with Greg Shepherd. He is the Synod's representative to help us consider and prepare for endowments to enhance our future financial stability. His services are of no cost to us and we intend to pursue his instruction. Stay tuned for more.

He showed us that a church's financial standing is based on a three legged stool. Those of you with experience with three legged stools know they cannot wobble. They are very stable. One leg is our weekly offerings. The second leg is our offerings for specific things (not to the General Fund or mortgage). And the third leg is leaving a legacy to your church in your final bequests. It is surprisingly easy and there are wonderful tax benefits for your survivors when done properly. I got the impression that inheritances left improperly, according to the tax code, send unnecessary dollars to the tax people. Left properly, those same dollars could go to your church. Interesting, huh? Stay tuned.

By this point you should have received a quarterly financial report showing our income is a fraction less than we had hoped, but so are our expenses. If you remember, our budget shows expenses of \$2,000 a month more than our expected income. This is after all our reserves are exhausted. It is time for us once again to step up to make up the difference. There are plans afoot again for Christmas in July. Again, stay tuned.

The financial picture is complicated and challenging, but doable. It will take many different approaches and all of them will be important. Short of someone winning the lottery and gifting us with a huge check, we are left to wait on the blessings of God. But waiting on God does not mean doing nothing. It means doing lots of things and each one counts for something, no matter how small.

We have come a long way over the past year. We have identified where our challenges are and have explored ways to meet those challenges. Your council president likes to say 'nobody buys a ticket to the Titanic.' And he is right. But we no longer have the taint of the Titanic. We have potential and promise. We have God desiring to bless our ministry into the community.

Your church council has an exciting proposal for the future of our church. After much prayer and consideration, we would like to expand the miracle on Nason St. by increasing our ministries and expanding our outreach. But first, the facts:

- ➤ Our property and building is worth over \$1.3 million dollars
- Our current loan has around \$180 thousand dollars remaining in the next five years at 5 1/8% to the Mission Investment Fund
 - This results in monthly loan payments of \$3,890
 - The mission investment fund is not willing to lower our interest rates

Our proposal is to have the members (current, former, & future) and friends of Lord of Life assume the loan and allow for the expansion of ministries and outreach. This is how it is going to be done:

- We ask everyone to pray for this church, its ministries, and its expansion into the community
- We offer bonds that will pay you back with interest on your investment
- ➤ We have a goal of \$200 thousand with bonds in \$5,000 blocks with a term of one, three and five years. (There are also five \$1,000 blocks available)
- > The interest rates are simple and paid annually
 - \$1000 block for one year @ 1.75%
 - \$5000 block for one year @2%
 - \$5000 block for three years @ 2.5%
 - \$5000 block for five years @ 3%

We need your prayer and commitment during the months of April and May. If we have reached our goal by the end of May, we can collect the funds during June, pay off our high interest loan, and start expanding our ministries. Now is the time to pray about investing your money where your heart is and just see what God can do with this miracle on Nason Street.
