



How does Lutheran World Relief use our Health Kits and Quilts?

Lutheran World Relief has distributed millions of quilts and kits to people living in more than 100 countries around the world. When fighting broke out between Israel and Hezbollah, 10,500 quilts and 18,700 health kits were shipped there for people displaced by the violence.

In 2005, when the 7.6 earthquake destroyed villages in Pakistan, LWR send an initial shipment of 3,750 quilts almost immediately after the quake. Pakistan Airways provided free delivery. Soon, another 11,250 quilts arrived by ship. On April 12, 2007, quilts were sent to flood victims in Zambia. Displaced people in Sri Lanka received quilts and health kits on March 26, 2007.

A quilt is special because it not only brings warmth on a cold night and shelter from the sun, but it becomes a bed, room divider, and backpack to carry belongings. At times, it is even a home. It costs \$2.00 to handle and ship one quilt overseas. LWR seeks lasting solutions to poverty and injustice and, in so doing, compels U.S. Lutherans to put their faith into action.

Coming Down the Stretch...

It can't be much longer now, can it? Pastor Dave retired 16 months ago, then Pastor Kenneth blessed us with a year of his life, and now Pastor Chuck continues the trend of powerful and inspiring spiritual leaders. We continue our search for God's nominee to serve our parish and our community. Lord of Life people! Have you stopped praying???

The Old Testament is full of stories of the people thinking the solution was just around the corner – but God needed to test their will; He needed them to get the old them out from themselves so that He could be their one true God, their only Lord. Sometimes God makes us wait.

In the meantime, what are we doing? Are we still waiting – or are we getting to work to do the good things we have learned over the years?

We are entrusted to the good stewardship of all the gifts we have been given. Some of those gifts refer to our faith and our love for Jesus and the change He has made in our lives. Are we continuing our scripture study and our daily prayer time? Are we reaching out to those in the margins; to those who reach out for help as we make our way around town? Are we being the people God wants us to be – or are we waiting for the new pastor to ride into town?

As we interview candidates for this ministry, they all want to know what we are doing. What are we all about? Are we continuing to maintain and grow all the good things we have been encouraged to do? New pastors want to know that if they, for some reason, don't take the next step – the congregation will likely trample them from behind (rather than to stop in their tracks waiting for their next move.) We have been well prepared to do ministry in this community – so let's be sure we are doing it!

Our Worship time continues to uplift and bless each of us. Thank you to so many who are involved in Sunday mornings. Your work and warmth is noticed and appreciated. Oh sure, we've had a few "rough" Sundays, but we are a

people who love to worship and praise the great Lord of Lords!

... and who would have thought we would all sing the Lord's Prayer so beautifully???

As I talk to congregations who have recently called new pastors, I find we're not taking as long as I thought (believe me, the committee knows we have been at this a long time...) In fact, the quickest call was right at 18 months, but most are closer to 2 years before the new leader moves in to town. I contend this is the waiting time God is using to help us grow; so we can grow in our stewardship – grow in discipleship – grow in faith – grow in personal ministry – grow in our working together – grow in service – and so we can grow in making Him our Lord of all Lords.


So as we come down the stretch, let me challenge your waiting time:

- if you're not reading some scripture each day, start today. Pick a book you'll like – ask pastor for help picking a starting point.
- If you're not praying every day, start today. Do it your way at your time.
- If you're not involved in a church ministry, contact a council member and ask how you can get involved.
- If you're not worshipping regularly, start this Sunday. Your presence blesses us.
- If you need a hug, let us know. We're good huggers!

As one of Pacifica's favorite congregations, we're being watched by Synod leaders and surrounding congregations and their pastors. Let's let them know that we are healthy and able to do even the waiting with the same excitement and purpose that have come to define us as a people of God.

I thank God for each of you and for all the good work that you do.

Projection System Approved by Church Council *Submitted by Bob Vernlund*

We are ready to take a step forward in trying to expand and enhance our worship experience. After extensive research we have agreed upon a projection system that we can use in our Sanctuary that will offer us many new options. The council has agreed to a system with a projected cost of \$8,000 to include installation of the projector, powered screen, a laptop computer, and necessary software. The only stipulation was that this system must be paid for out of funds designated to the projection fund and not come out of our church budget. This is where you come in. We need your support to make this happen!

This system will expand our ability in areas other than our worship service and will include some bible study (youth & adult), music, and other Christian entertainment. It will be connected to our existing sound system and be controlled by a computer that has the ability to play CDs and DVDs. This is a step in faith that should allow us to offer more programs for both our youth and adults. It is not intended to make us a "paperless" congregation, but rather, an enhanced worship experience. After much discussion and prayer, we feel that this is something we must pursue. We would very much like to provide a 30-45 minute period after our worship service for both our youth and adults and this system makes that more possible.
