Dated September 3, 2009 Hello friends - Blessings to you all this day. I hope this finds you well. This is to serve as an update, or for some who have not been at church for the last couple of weeks; a new bit of information as it relates to the Sexuality discussion that just took place back in Minnesota as the ELCA Churchwide assembly came together in August to vote on the Ordination of folks in same-sex relationships. The assembly did vote to extend Ordination to folks in a same-sex relationship by a vote of 559-451; this is one of many votes that were done at the assembly. This became a point of conversation these last two weeks at Lord of Life Lutheran following our worship experiences together. My goal of the two conversation times was to give a safe place for all to come and share where all stand on the issue. My goal was accomplished. I let folks know that after five years of looking at the issue, my Bound Conscience led me to vote not in favor of this; which I did at the Pacifica Synod assembly just recently held in Riverside. I mentioned that this was the most difficult vote I have ever cast, but in the end I made it. I want to model that even in the midst of disagreeing on something, WE all can co-exist in community together. I say this because a few of our brothers and sisters are saying that we need to leave the ELCA. That, my friends, is an easy thing to say. Here are some things to consider if one really wants to act on this:

- 1) The church where we worship on Nason St. would likely stay with the ELCA; there is a good chance that this property would not leave with the folks.
- 2) I am recognized as a public minister in the ELCA as my Letter of Call states. So, Lord of Life

leaving the ELCA; would, as I look at it now, mean that I would be leaving Lord of Life too.

3) Where, then, would the next pastor of Lord of Life come from? That would be a question to seriously consider.

These all are things to consider. I also want you to consider what Bishop Finck of Pacifica Synod made mention of in a letter that he wrote after attending the Churchwide assembly:

-This action (Ordination) does not require every congregation to find ways to recognize relationships they believe are contrary to the understanding of Holy Scripture.

-Remember that the system for the rostering of our leaders and the extension of congregational calls will remain the same. Individual congregations, working in partnership with our synod staff, will finally determine whom to call as their pastor or other rostered leaders in a process guided by the Holy Spirit.

Friends, this took place just recently as brothers and sisters on Lord of Life's Call Committee interviewed 12 candidates to become the next pastor of the congregation. In that group of 12; from what I understand, was a person or two who are gay, lesbian. The Committee at the time had power to extend a call, or to not extend a call...that will not change going forward.

The ELCA made a decision that many people disagree with, but one that some people do agree with. Are you the members/friends of Lord of Life Lutheran Church going to allow this issue to divide the church? If you want this to divide, it will. I choose to think that it does not have to have this result. I also refuse to think that this issue has to be one that overshadows all of the fantastic ministries, all of the fantastic ways that we proclaim God's Good News to all in our mission field of Moreno Valley, and surrounding areas. My faith in God is so strong, I refuse to think that a single decision could do that.

We had a good turnout for the first two meetings; but not all of you did or were able to come. Going forward, you are always free to engage me in conversation about this. I am re-doing the first few weeks of the Adult Education schedule to make room for us to look at a variety of documents that will be available for you to pick-up this weekend. Read them all! May God's continued presence be with all as we journey forward in service to Him. Peace,

November 22nd


We are once again getting ready to provide a Thanksgiving dinner to those struggling in our area. Our goal is to provide baskets of food that include a turkey, potatoes,
