On August 15-19, our ELCA
Church wide Assembly met in
Orlando, Florida. This year's
theme was "Freed in Christ to
Serve." Here's a review of how we

function together.

There are 4.5 million members in the ELCA. We are called "evangelical" because that literally means "Good news." Martin Luther wanted his reformed Churches to call themselves "evangelical," not "Lutheran." In Europe, the Lutherans call themselves "Evangelicals," so we stand with them in our use of the e-word. But we use the e-word differently than most of the American culture, and that sometimes causes misunderstandings.

We are the 7th largest Christian body in the USA: 1) Roman Catholic 68 million; 2) Southern Baptist 16.2 million; 3) United Methodist 6.8 million; 4)LDS Mormon 5.9 million; 5)Church of God 5.5 million; 6)National Baptist 5 million. The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod has 2.3 million members, and is the 14th largest denomination. The Wisconsin Synod has been in the news lately because Michele Bachmann has been a member of it for more than a decade. They claim 390,000 members. We (ELCA) consider ourselves to be one church in three "expressions": 1) Local Congregation; 2) the regional area known as a Synod; 3) Church wide expression (ELCA). The word "synod" is


a Greek word which means "a journey together." It is applied in different ways by different Christians.

For us, the synod is a geographical area. Roman Catholics and Episcopalians talk about a diocese. Methodists and Missouri Synod Lutherans call it a district. The Pacifica Synod includes Hawaii along with Southern California. There are 65 Synods in the ELCA encompassing the Bahamas and the Caribbean. One of our synods is called the Zion Slovak Synod, united by heritage, not geography. Like most synods, we meet annually as an "assembly." Our bishops are elected for six year terms. Murray Finck is our bishop in his third term. Our presiding Bishop is Mark Hanson, serving his second term. The ELCA has been in the forefront of all American Churches in its innovative use of the internet. If you have a computer with access to the internet, you can watch the assembly through streaming video. A special town hall forum was held on Tuesday, August 18th and included a social statement on genetics. You can also follow it on Facebook and Twitter. I encourage you to consider a renewal time of "Journey with Jesus" each day. Choose a Bible verse, a hymn, or a prayer for a day or a week and remember it during the day. Open your heart and mind to God's presence and receive God's companionship in silence and in Word. God will bless you! In His love and in His Grip, Pastor Chuck



The Truck is Coming!


The Truck is Coming!
