Did you ever stop to think of the service that the church offers to its members? This is a good topic for

liscussion. The following article comes from ny good friend and mentor, Reverend Bob Hyson, from Trinity Lutheran Church in Landsdale, PA., from the "Landsdale Lutheran," Aug., 1986.

Some would say the Church does nothing - it's really quite useless. Others would add that they remember a time when the Church really did something good: It had good BBQ dinners, good rummage sales, and good old hymns.

Well, I would like to share with you just a few things about what the Church is good for. We all need to be refreshed about these things every so often or we become complacent, and feel the Church is not really doing much for us. What does church do for you?

- 1. It offers you an opportunity to hear and learn from God's word every Sunday throughout the year. And that opportunity is for everyone.
- 2. Your Church feeds you with the bread and wine of the Body of Christ that offers you strength and renewal in your faith.
- 3. Your Church baptizes your children and instructs them in the Christian way of life. It confirms them at the altar and leads them to Christ.
- 4. Your Church unites couples in holy marriage and adds God's blessing to their union.
- 5. Your Church comes into your home at a time of sickness or sorrow to bring prayer, cheer, and comfort.

- 6. Your Church stands by the bedside at life's end and sheds light upon the homeward path.
- 7. Your Church stands by the bereaved families at the open grave to heal the wounds of separation with the ointment of God's promise that "you shall rise again."
- 8. Your Church supports the homes for the elderly and for children, where they may be tenderly cared for.
- 9. Your Church supports Christian colleges where young people are educated in the various professions and life work.
- 10. Your church helps carry out the Lord's command to preach the Gospel at home and abroad, and to make the witness world-wide.
- 11. Your church stands by you in all kinds of trouble. If sick, it visits you in the hospital. If young people find themselves in trouble, the church is there, too.
- 12. Your church follows you in other communities when you move, showing a concern for its people wherever they may be.

What good is the church? I often think of my father's comment..."Take the churches out of the community, and this world will be a much poorer place in which to live."

So think "What good is the church?" then remember that you and the church, with the help of Jesus, make our community a wonderful place. Are we doing all we can as a Church, the body of Christ? What can we do better, and how? I look forward to your response. Amen.


